

Legislative Update

- The legislature expanded Nebraska's R&D incentives with an enhanced 35-percent income tax credit for any business spending on research and experiments conducted at a facility owned by a Nebraska college, community college or university. The former R&D credit was 15 percent.
- Legislators also extended the termination date for portions of the Nebraska Advantage Act, a major state incentive program. The new sunset date of December 31, 2015, applies to Tiers 1 and 3 of the Nebraska Advantage, as well as the Research and Development Act and the Microenterprise Tax Credit Act.
