

## **Legislative Update**

• The \$185-million N.D. Commerce Dept. budget bill includes a 50-percent increase in Workforce Enhancement grants, \$2.5 million to support innovation and entrepreneurship, an extended Property Tax Reduction and Sales and Use Tax Exemption for wind power, as well as an extended Income Tax Credit for the installation of any renewable Energy Device, including geothermal, solar, wind and biomass; \$3 million for the Renew-

able Energy Fund; \$17 million for agriculture research infrastructure, including \$11.4 million for Phase II of the NDSU Research Greenhouse; \$2.6 million for a beef research facility, and \$2.9 million for improvements to Research Extension Centers. The legislation also provides \$20 million for Centers of Excellence grants, including \$10 million for enhancement grants at UND and NDSU.
