

Legislative Update

- New legislation increases the tax on petroleum products, also known as the Barrel Tax, from \$0.05 to \$1.55 per barrel. The revenues raised by the tax will provide \$22 million per year to help with the deficit and appropriate \$11 million to funds relating to renewable energy, food selfsufficiency, and climate change.
- A new law abolishes a package of tax credits known as Act 221 for hightechnology investors seven months earlier than its original expiration

date of Dec. 31, while another bill suspends for three years tax credits that already were promised to current investors. The two measures follow changes made to Act 221 in 2009. Lawmakers established a cap investors to deducting 80 percent of their investment over five years. It also restricted investors without Hawaii tax liability from transferring their credits to Hawaii-based investors, typically in exchange for more equity in the tech company.
