


Legislative Update

Gov. Dave Heineman in April signed LB 1048 into law. The bill is designed to encourage the development, ownership and operation of renewable energy facilities for the export of wind energy from Nebraska. LB 1048

preserves the benefits Nebraskans receive as a result of the state's unique public power system by allowing the Nebraska Power Review Board to approve wind energy operations designed to export energy.

Did you Know?

- The Nebraska Customized Job Training Program provides flexible and discretionary job training grants. Program priorities are (1) customized training projects that result in increased investment and employment and where the training assistance is a significant incentive for the project to be undertaken in Nebraska rather than in another state; (2) non-incentive customized training projects where there is increased investment and employment but no incentive is involved; and (3) customized training projects that involve retraining of existing workers to upgrade their skills as a result of investment in new capital.
- Local governments may use tax increment financing (TIF) only in redeveloping substandard and blighted areas. Following such designation, a community redevelopment agency prepares a redevelopment plan. TIF projects may be commercial, residential, industrial, or mixed use. Generally, TIF funds can be used for land acquisition, public improvements and amenities, infrastructure, and utilities.
