

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#### **Did You Know?**

- A 2010 report from the Center for Economic Policy Research says North Carolina has the lowest unionization rate in the country, at 4.1 percent.
- As one of the 11 states (plus D.C.) named as winners of U.S. Dept. of Education "Race to the Top" funding, the state will receive \$400 million to support comprehensive education reform.
- North Carolina State University is home to the Database of State Incentives for Renewable and Efficiency (www.dsireusa.org), a comprehensive source of nationwide information on incentives and policies at the state, local, utility and federal levels. Established in 1995 and funded by the U.S. Department of Energy, DSIRE is an ongoing project of the N.C. Solar Center and the Interstate Renewable Energy Council.

#### **Legislative Update**

- HB 1973, and SB 1171, the "Keeping North Carolina Competitive Act," include multiple provisions that enhance film production tax credits; create a new credit for producers of interactive digital media; modify and enhance the sales and use tax benefits for data centers; create sales and use tax benefits for certain industrial facilities; and extend the sunset for Article 3J tax credits until Jan. 1, 2014. The measure extends the sunsets for incentives involving renewable fuel facilities, biodiesel producers, interstate passenger air carriers, and professional motorsports racing teams and sanctioning bodies. It also creates incentives for eco-industrial parks.
- SB 778 clarified the application of the State Environmental Policy Act (originally passed in the 1970s to apply to publicsector building projects) to private-sector projects receiving state and local incentives was unnecessary, given already-inplace review processes.
