



Legislative Update

- Among other plans, Gov. McDonnell's 2012 transportation agenda calls for the establishment of an Interstate 85 Connector Economic Development and Promotion Zone to encourage businesses to invest in Virginia and ship through Virginia ports.
- A new law allows localities to decide whether to impose the BPOL tax on a business's gross receipts or its Virginia taxable income. Another measure allows localities to provide relief from license taxes to any business
- locating in the locality for the first time, for the first two years after such location.
- A new measure creates a separate classification of machinery and tools designed and used directly in manufacturing or processing materials, components, or equipment for national defense, so that local governments would be authorized to tax such machinery and tools at a rate that is less than the rate generally applicable to machinery and tools.
