



Legislative Update

- Incentive measures signed into law in 2012 include extending tax abatement periods for large data center projects, increasing film incentive yearly caps from \$10 million to \$15 million for 2013 and 2014 and \$20 million beyond that, allowing larger projects of over \$1 million and 100 new jobs to carry forward any unused capital credits for four years after the normal 20-year period expires and expanding the state's incentives program to include a "tourism destination attraction" or commercial
- enterprise designed to attract visitors among others.
- House Bill 39, called the "Aviation Amendment," provides a state sales tax exemption that applies to aviation-related businesses.
- Senate Bill 459, signed into law in May, eliminates red tape for business tax filings. The law uses an electronic, single-point-of-filing system through which businesses can file all sales, use, and rental/lease tax returns and make the associated payments for all locations in the state.
