## **Legislative Update**

Gov. Scott's Job Creation and Economic Growth Agenda, signed into law in March, includes measures to make regional work-force boards accountable; reform unemployment compensation; eliminate hundreds of burdensome state rules and regulations; and implement tax cuts: (1) the corporate

income tax exemption is doubled to \$50,000, eliminating 25 percent of remaining payers, and (2) Florida manufacturers will now be able to more easily qualify for a sales-tax exemption on machinery and equipment, as the required increase in output has gone from 10 percent to 5 percent.
