



Legislative Update

- On May 23, 2012, Gov. Haslam signed into law two bills that reshape various state boards and commissions in an effort to increase performance, accountability and efficiency in state government. The bills make structural changes to the Tennessee Regulatory Authority and 21 boards, commissions and licensing programs.
- The Tennessee Legislature approved a request by Gov. Haslam to expand
 the state's Fast Track economic development program to allow taxpayerfunded grants to be used to build, equip or renovate facilities for new
 businesses that create jobs in Tennessee.
