



Legislative Update

- On Sept. 4, 2012, Gov. Shumlin said he would ask lawmakers to allow both Barre and South Burlington to qualify for the Tax Increment Financing program. Legislative action was needed because a statutory cap of six TIF districts was enacted under new TIF rules adopted in 2006.
- On Feb. 6, Gov. Shumlin announced a plan to allow businesses with more than 50 employers to remain outside the state-mandated Health Insurance Exchange until 2016. "Vermont is creating the first single-payer plan in America that will make health a right and not a privilege, contain costs and make Vermont the affordable health care state," he said.
