

Legislative Update

Through the EARN job training program, signed into law in May, the state invests in employer-led skills training initiatives in some of its most high-demand sectors: construction, advanced manufacturing, cybersecurity and wellness.

• The transportation package signed into law in May is projected to create an estimated 57,200 jobs over the next six years, and inject \$4.4 billion into Maryland's

Did You Know?

- Education Week's "Quality Counts" report in 2013 named Maryland's the No. 1 public school system in the U.S. The U.S. Chamber of Commerce has now for two years in a row named Maryland the #1 State in America for innovation and entrepreneurship.
- Maryland's cybersecurity cluster encompasses more than 50 key federal facilities and 12 major military installations, and 9,500 businesses employing 140,000 people in cyberrelated fields. Those people can boast an average salary of \$82,000.
- National Science Foundation figures released in December 2013 found Johns Hopkins the top institution for R&D spending in FY 2012 with \$2.1 billion in spending. The University of Maryland at College Park was 37th with \$502 million, and the University of Maryland at Baltimore was 47th with \$433 million.
- Snapshot 1954: In 1954 the University
 of Maryland became the first state
 university below the Mason-Dixon
 Line to integrate. The city of Laurel,
 whose population today is more than
 25,000, in May that year welcomed
 its first dial telephones, enabling
 direct-dial calls.
