

Legislative Update

- In June Gov. Heineman signed into law a bill that includes a provision that would prevent an increase in local sales taxes by a half-cent in Omaha. The bill also offers tax breaks for a Kansas wind energy development company, which Heineman opposed.
- Gov. Heineman signed into law several bills that will bring tax relief, including



the elimination of Nebraska's alternative minimum tax for middle class families, and a measure allowing small businesses to carry forward their net operating losses for 20 years instead of the current policy of five years. Additional tax relief bills include a law expanding the capital gains exclusion for employees whose companies have an Employee Stock Ownership Plan.
