

# **Legislative Update**

- In October 2013, Gov. Walker signed a \$100-million property tax relief bill into law.
- In October 2013, a bill designed to offer greater investment capital access to startup companies was signed into law. In addition to creating crowd-funding exemptions, the bill makes changes to Wisconsin's securities registration laws related to types of investor and financial institution holding companies.

- A new law creates an apprenticeship completion awards program that provides for tuition reimbursement to workers and employers. The program will be administered by the Department of Workforce Development.
- Wisconsin legislators passed Assembly Bill 181 which allocated \$25 million to establish an economic development program within the Department of Administration to invest in venture capital funds.

- Wisconsin was ranked 17th in Top States for Business in 2012 by CNBC.
- The state is bordered by two Great Lakes and the Mississippi River and has 20 commercial ports that handle over \$7 billion of cargo annually.
- More than \$1.2 billion per year in academic R&D is conducted at the University of Wisconsin. The university also has the second largest investment endowment in the U.S. and is ranked third in strength of research focus and fourth in patent generation.

- The state awarded \$5.1 million in grants to six communities to help spur redevelopment on abandoned industrial sites throughout Wisconsin. The program, the Idle Industrial Sites Redevelopment Program, is administered by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation.
- The EAA AirVenture Museum located in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, is one of the most extensive aviation attractions in the world, with more than 200 historic airplanes.
