Legislative Update

- Gov. Malloy announced a \$3.5-million matching grant voucher program as part of the new Connecticut Manufacturing Innovation Fund (CMIF). The program offers matching grants of between \$5,000 and \$50,000 for manufacturers with up to 300 employees located in or moving operations to the state.
- The state offered a \$400-million tax credit incentive to United Technologies Corp. (UTC) in return for \$500 million in upgrades at Pratt & Whitney, Sikorsky and UTC Aerospace facilities, and a promise to keep Pratt & Whitney headquarters in Connecticut for 15 years.
- Connecticut's minimum wage rises to \$10.10 per hour by Jan. 2017.
