Legislative Update

- The state launched the \$3-million Delaware Cyber Initiative to develop partnerships between academia, workers and the private sector to develop a skilled and innovative cybersecurity workforce.
- The legislature approved \$7 million to establish and fund Downtown Development Districts.

• The Accelerated Career Paths program creates a partnership between the Delaware Manufacturing Association, Delaware Technical and Community College and the Delaware Department of Education and allows high school juniors and seniors to earn professional manufacturing certificates at graduation.
