Legislative Update

- House Bill 301 makes it easier for any eligible small business to apply and qualify for the Kentucky Small Business Tax Credit.
- Other economic development legislation signed into law in 2014 resulted in \$30 million in bonds to extend high-speed broadband access across the state via the Next Generation Information

Highway, beginning in Eastern Kentucky; \$24 million in bonds to build an advanced manufacturing training center in Georgetown; \$200,000 each year to fund administrative costs of the "Shaping Our Appalachian Region" initiative; and \$2 million each year for a new Regional Strategic Development Fund.
