Legislative Update

- Gov.-elect Wolf inherits a budget deficit that the state's Independent Fiscal Office (IFO) projects at more than \$1.5 billion and increasing over subsequent years. The same IFO showed year-over-year net job growth of 45,700 jobs in Oct. 2014, and an unemployment rate that had dropped to 5.4 percent in Oct. 2014 from 6.9 percent in Dec. 2013.
- Pennsylvania continues to phase out its capital stock tax, but while the tax was supposed to be eliminated in 2014, policymakers have extended the length of the phase-out until 2016.
- Outgoing Gov. Tom Corbett in Nov. announced updated guidelines for the City Revitalization and Improvement Zone (CRIZ) program.
