Legislative Update

- The legislature overrode Gov. Pete Ricketts' veto to enact a gas tax of 1.5 cents per gallon over the next four years. The new tax takes effect Jan. 1, 2016, and will culminate when a 6-cent increase is reached on January 1, 2019. The projected revenue by 2019 is expected to total more than \$76 million, and will be used for road and bridge construction.
- The fiscal year 2016-2017 budget includes a 3-percent funding increase of the University of Nebraska, State Colleges, and Community Colleges. Funding is also included for several specific items for the University of Nebraska, including more than \$3.8 million combined in operating and program costs for the Health Science Education Center for fiscal years 2016 and 2017, and more than \$1.2 million annually to support the Yeutter Institute for International Trade and Finance.



Did You Know?

The state's capital, Lincoln, has one of the lowest unemployment rates in the country — preliminary figures from the Bureau of Labor Statistics put the figure at 2.2 percent in September 2015. The city has become a hotbed of tech startups with a surprising \$80 million in venture capital inflows in the first six months of 2015.

According to the US Bureau of Economic Analysis, Nebraska's five largest industries in 2014 were finance, insurance, real estate, rental and leasing (\$20.2 billion); manufacturing (\$13.7 billion); government (\$13.5 billion) agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting (\$10.2 billion); and professional and business services (\$10 billion).

In 2014, Nebraska imported over \$4.05 billion worth of goods, up from around \$3.7 billion in 2013. The top five import countries in value of dollars are Canada, China, Germany, Mexico and Japan. Nebraska companies exported more than \$7.9 billion worth of goods in 2014. The state's top five export markets in 2014 were the same five in a different order: Canada, Mexico, Japan, China and Korea.
