Legislative Update

Gov. Asa Hutchinson (R)

- Arkansas voters passed an amendment to the Arkansas
 Constitution that will change how the state can issue bonds
 for large economic development projects. It removes the cap
 on Amendment 82 general obligation bonds, makes Arkansas
 more competitive for large projects while still allowing the state
 legislature to decide what if any incentives should be
 offered, and makes it possible to use Amendment 82 for more
 than one project at a time with legislative approval.
- Arkansas' legislature met from April 13th through May 9th and had two special sessions on healthcare and on transportation.
 On May 23rd, the governor signed the Arkansas Highway Improvement Plan of 2016.
- On April 8th, Gov. Asa Hutchinson signed Arkansas Works legislation into law, which is a State-initiated reform of Medicaid for low-income populations designed to emphasize work; personal responsibility; employer-based insurance coverage and program reforms to protect the taxpayers.
