Legislative Update

- The Legislature approved a budget for the next fiscal year that includes a 6.6 percent increase in state general funds over this year’s level, for a total amount of \$3.27 billion in general fund spending. Additionally, the Legislature increased the public education budget by 7.4 percent, which amounts to a \$1.58 billion K-12 budget for the next fiscal year. Included in the public education budget are funds to increase teacher salaries as part of the second year of a five-year plan per the Governor’s task force recommendations. Legislators also approved \$279.6 million for the higher education budget, while at the same time balancing the state budget per Idaho’s constitutional mandate.
