- Gov. Sandoval convened a special session in October to approve a Las Vegas package that included a convention center expansion, construction of an NFL stadium for the Oakland Raiders that would also serve the football team from UNLV (and receive \$500 million from Las Vegas Sands Corp. CEO Sheldon Adelson), and funding more police. The session produced a bill signed by Sandoval. The stadium is scheduled to be completed in 2019, with the Raiders playing their first game there in 2020.
- The last special session called by Gov. Sandoval, in December 2015, approved incentives for Faraday Future's \$1-billion, electric vehicle production complex in North Las Vegas that could create as many as 4,500 jobs over the next seven years.
