

## Legislative Update

- Connecticut’s two-year, \$41.3-billion budget, signed by Gov. Malloy after a four-month stalemate, reduces or eliminates funding to a number of state economic development programs, including the Small Business Express program, set to be eliminated in year two; the Manufacturing Assistance Act, cut by \$50 million in the budget’s second year; and the Manufacturing Innovation Fund, reduced by \$10 million.
- The state budget, which takes steps to close Connecticut’s \$3.5-billion deficit, provides nearly \$50 million to prevent Hartford from slipping into bankruptcy. The budget lends state backing to a refinancing of Hartford’s \$620-million debt and creates a \$28-million restructuring fund for the city.
- Public Acts 17-219 and 17-226 require that the state Department of Economic Community Development (DECD) and the state Auditors of Public Accounts make yearly reviews of Connecticut’s economic development programs. The reports are expected to cast light on which programs are most effective and which industries are responding to economic incentives.
