



Legislative Update

- Economic development legislation that would help bring a jack-up rig to Cook Inlet and improve the Skagway Ore Terminal received unanimous support. Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority can now invest in a corporation or LLC, which allows greater flexibility.
- The governor won approval of legislation to more than double the size of

the Southeast State Forest, creating more jobs in the timber industry.

 The Legislature approved funding of major transportation infrastructure such as roads to resources, including the road to Umiat, and access to the Ambler mining district. Lawmakers also funded major port projects including Anchorage, Point Mackenzie, and Skagway.
