



Legislative Update

- According to the Economic Development Association of North Dakota, the Centers of Excellence bill, amended to include the Dept. of Commerce appropriation, includes \$1.5 million for Workforce Enhancement Grants; \$12 million for Centers of Research Excellence; and an Automation Tax Credit that begins for the 2013 tax year.
- HB 1013 raises the amount of tax revenue distributed by the oil and gas

- impact grant fund from \$8 million to \$100 million per biennium.
- SB 2048 requires reporting to the Department of Commerce when a development project receives benefits through both a renaissance zone and a tax increment financing (TIF) district. SB 2218 increases the ceiling on total tax credits allowed for investments in renaissance fund organizations from \$7.5 million to \$8.5 million.
