

## **Legislative Update**

"The 2011 Oregon Legislature was the best for legislation aimed at job
growth and economic growth in a decade," said the Oregon Prosperity
Project. "Home runs" included passage of SB 301, which allows Oregon
companies to access federal tax incentives, including bonus depreciation
and increased expensing limits for the purchase of job-creating capital

equipment. "Extra-base hits" included passage of enhanced career and technical education. SB 766 "accomplished two important goals for land zoned for industrial use: It speeds up permitting processes for industrial projects on this land and protects this land from conversion to other uses or unnecessary overlays or restrictions."
