

Legislative Update

A major provision of the budget signed into law in June by Gov. Scott Walker was the elimination of the Department of Commerce, whose economic development role is now filled by the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC). Among many measures highlighted by the end-of-session summary from Wisconsin Manufacturers & Commerce were: a manufacturers tax credit that nearly eliminates income taxes paid

on income generated from manufacturing in Wisconsin; limits on property tax increases imposed by municipalities, schools, counties, and technical college districts; comprehensive collective bargaining reform that will help state and local governments control spending, and will diminish the strength and power of public employee unions in Wisconsin; and a two-year corporate income tax holiday for new businesses that locate in Wisconsin.
