Legislative Update

- · Small business tax cuts passed in 2012 that eliminated income taxes on non-wage business income were preserved by the Kansas legislature during the 2015 session, despite a \$340-million budget shortfall. Instead the legislature focused on increasing revenue through consumption taxes; raising the state's sales tax to 6.5 percent and taxes on a pack of cigarettes an additional 79 cents to \$1.29 per pack.
- The Kansas legislature moved the state from an arrayed system of unemployment insurance, where the contribution rate tables reset every year, to a fixed system where contribution rates are placed in statute. The new fixed system taxes employers based on their experience rather than an arbitrary formula of what the fund needs.
- The state's renewable energy mandate has been replaced with a voluntary goal of 20 percent renewable energy by 2020. Property tax exemptions for new wind projects will be limited to 10 years rather than the previous lifetime exemption.



Did You Know?

The 150-acre Wichita State University Innovation Campus (WSUIC), currently under construction, will provide a venue for researchers and technologists from private enterprise to work closely with faculty and students from WSU to create and deploy globally competitive technologies in critical areas including aerospace, bio-medical engineering, software and software engineering, and human factors psychology. European aerospace giant Airbus is moving its North American engineering headquarters to the WSUIC.

The state's public high school graduation rate and percentage of the population with a bachelor's degree are above the national average. In Johnson County (Kansas City metropolitan area), more than 50 percent of adults 25 and older have a college degree.
