Legislative Update

- In November, legislative leaders reached an agreement with Gov. Hogan to approve a conditional \$20-million loan for Northrop Grumman's retention and growth and a \$22-million loan to Marriott International for its new HQ in Bethesda from the state's Sunny Day Fund in exchange for Hogan's pledge to introduce legislation in 2017 to provide more funding to Maryland counties for public-school teacher pensions.
- The Maryland Chamber in its summary reports that the House and Senate could not come to agreement on a tax package that in differing versions included rate reductions for various income levels, and earned income tax credit and single-sales-factor apportionment. One measure would have reduced the corporate income tax rate from the current 8.25 percent to 7 percent over the course of a few years.
- The Maryland WorkSmart program partners the state's 16 community colleges with local employers to build customized workforce training and assess future training needs.
