



## **Legislative Update**

- A new measure amends the Public School Code to allow students in career and technology education to demonstrate proficiency and readiness for high school graduation in an alternative pathway, and removes the statutory requirement for the Keystone Exam on that student population.
- Supported by Gov. Wolf and, according to some polls, 70
  percent of Pennsylvanians, a new severance tax on shale gas
  has yet to make headway despite attempts late in the year to
  insert it into budget measures. Pennsylvania is the only major
  gas-producing state without a severance tax.
