



Legislative Update

- Indiana's two-year budget provides a 2.5% increase of \$763 million for K-12 education, but omits explicit language to raise teachers' salaries commensurate to surrounding states. The budget contains up to \$205 million for key rail projects, including one that's to speed travel into Chicago.
- A complex gambling bill approved in May paved the way for new casinos
 in Gary and Terre Haute. Spectacle Entertainment, a specific beneficiary of
 the action, had spent \$50,000 to fly Gov. Holcomb privately to out-of-state
 political meetings, prompting rivals to call for an investigation. The limit on
 casinos owned by a single operator was raised from two to six. Betting on
 professional sports now is allowed at casinos and on mobile devices.
- Newly passed tax incentives position Indiana as a top location for data centers. The incentives law, signed in June, provides exemptions from the state's sales tax for electricity and equipment as well as construction and buildout costs for up to 50 years.
- An Act signed into law in April is to enable a Professional Sports Development
 Area in Indianapolis that would include a multi-purpose soccer stadium for
 the Indy Eleven professional soccer team, which has proposed a \$550 million
 real estate district to include lodging, office, residential and retail space.



Did You Know?

Indiana's corporate tax rate shrank to 5.5% in 2019 and is scheduled to drop to 4.9% by 2022 under a tax cut package passed in 2014 during the governorship of Vice President Mike Pence.

Indianapolis-based Allison Transmission broke ground in June on a \$400 million expansion that's to create more than 300 jobs by the end of 2020. The expansion is to include a new Vehicle Environmental Test facility in Indianapolis and an Innovation Center for developing advancements in alternative fuel and electric vehicles.

Before enrolling at Indiana State University in 1975, future NBA legend Larry Bird drove a garbage truck while working on a municipal maintenance crew in the small Indiana town of French Lick. Bird would later tell Sports Illustrated: "I loved that job. It was outdoors and you were with your friends. I felt like I was really accomplishing something."
