

Legislative Update

House Bill 2167 establishes the Commercial Industrial Hemp Program.

Senate Substitute for House Bill 2167 requires the Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA), in consultation with the governor and attorney general, to submit a plan to the United States Department of Agriculture outlining how the state will monitor and regulate the commercial production of industrial hemp in Kansas, in accordance with federal law. The commercial growing program will replace the existing research program once it is finalized and approved by USDA.

A set of recommendations from the Governor's Council on Education submitted to Gov. Kelly in December focused on greater collaboration among businesses, workforce training programs and educators, along with enhanced access to a high-quality education for Kansans of all ages. Among them was the establishment of the Advantage Kansas Coalition, charged with implementing a robust cross-agency strategic plan, intentionally focused on aligning education and training with the workforce/talent needs of business, industry and human services in the state's top eight sectors.
