Legislative Update

L.D. 1711, an Act to Promote Solar Energy Projects and Distributed Generation Resources in Maine, will incentivize at least 375 MW of new distributed generation in Maine. The bill creates incentives for commercial and institutional customers and for community shared projects.

LD 994 requires the Public Utilities Commission to approve the contract for Maine Aqua Ventus, the first of its kind demonstration project of floating offshore wind in the United States.

The 2020-21 state budget includes several workforce training and higher education provisions, including \$900,000 for adult education, \$3 million for adult degree completion and \$2 million for early college. It also includes a nearly 3.3% increase for higher education and training programs — the Maine Community College System, the University of Maine System and Maine Maritime Academy — to help keep tuition fees down. Other budget items include ongoing workforce training funding for the Maine Community College System to help fill critical gaps in the workforce, and an additional \$3 million for the Maine State Grant program.
