Legislative Update

Two separate measures created a financial technology sandbox program and a medical digital innovation sandbox program.

The newly created Wyoming works program provides student grants and grants to community colleges for credential programs (technical training programs) to address workforce needs, funded by approximately \$2 million to the colleges and \$3 million toward student grants.

The Wyoming Department of Agriculture has submitted a plan to the USDA to regulate the hemp industry.
