# Legislative Update

- A law passed in July legalizes the growing, processing and sale of industrial hemp in Hawaii. The law allows hemp farmers to apply directly to the U.S. Department for Agriculture, thus saving the state more than \$500,000 that would have been used to pay state intermediaries.
- The state Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism, along
  with several Hawaii nonprofits and organizations, launched a jobs program
  to provide businesses with up to 650 workers displaced due to C0VID-19
  pandemic. The economic stimulus program, which is backed by \$10 million
  in federal CARES Act funding, matches displaced workers with companies in
  emerging industries such as conservation, renewable energy, agriculture,
  creative arts, aerospace, entrepreneurship and STEM fields, among others.
- As of July 1 2020, state facilities bigger than 10,000 sq. ft. (930 sq. m.) are
  required to implement cost-effective energy efficiency measures. The new
  law requires, where feasible, the design of all new state building construction
  to maximize energy and water efficiency and to use building materials that
  reduce the building's carbon footprint. The Hawaii State Energy Office is to
  collect utility bill and energy usage data for state-owned buildings and make
  the data available to the public.
