Legislative Update

A \$16 billion Transportation Bond Bill was signed into law on January 15, 2021 and authorizes funding across all modes of transportation to support and facilitate the ongoing continual efforts of MassDOT and the MBTA to invest in and modernize the Commonwealth's transportation system.

In October, the Baker-Polito Administration filed legislation to direct \$750 million to support the continued growth and development of the Commonwealth's clean energy industry. The legislation, An Act to Power Massachusetts' Clean Energy Economy, would establish a new Clean Energy Investment Fund, totaling \$750 million, that would support innovation, research and development, and job training in the clean energy sector, significantly expanding Massachusetts's national leadership on clean energy and climate change.

In September 2021, the Administration announced the release of a new report assessing the workforce strengths, gaps, and opportunities in Massachusetts for the emerging offshore wind industry.
