

## **GDP**





## Legislative Update

McMaster in November announced a \$17 million investment in the Workforce Scholarships for the Future pilot program and called upon the General Assembly to provide \$124 million in ARPA funds to extend the program through June 30. 2024. The program will address South Carolina's labor shortage by providing scholarships to cover the cost of tuition and required fees at any of the 16 technical colleges in South Carolina.

McMaster's proposed \$300 million investment to expand I-73 in the Grand Strand and Pee Dee region would be funded through South Carolina's share of ARPA dollars and non-recurring dollars from the state's projected \$1 billion budget surplus for the fiscal year 2022. A separate \$360 million of ARPA funds would be used to widen portions of I-26 between Columbia and Charleston.

Governor McMaster's January allocation of \$8 million in Governor's Emergency Education Relief funds to the state's technical colleges provided scholarships to cover the cost of retraining 3.100 South Carolinians. A new initiative between the S.C. Department of Employment and Workforce and the S.C. Technical College System allows unemployed South Carolina claimants the option of exploring short-term retraining programs offered at their local technical college in lieu of conducting a weekly job search, while continuing to receive benefits.
